

Community Case Management



CHALLENGE (WHY)

- ED utilization increased by 40% over 5 years
- Admissions increased by only 5.7%
- ☐ Inappropriate use of costly ED services
- ☐ Throughput and capacity issues

SOLUTION (WHAT)

- Evaluate Multi-visit patients (MVP'S)
- □ Patients with 12 or greater visits to ED in last 12 months
- ☐ Identify challenges and gaps in care for this population
- Connect to resources in the community which better serve their needs


PROJECT PLAN (HOW)

- Utilize RN and LMSW to work with individual patients outside the hospital
- ☐ Create a "Plan of Care" with the patient
- Document the plan to help guide ED providers for subsequent visits
- Develop an icon for the tracking board to easily identify Bridge Care patients


GOALS (IMPACT)

- Reduce ED visits for the MVP'S by 25%
- □ Direct patients to appropriate care settings
- ☐ Provide education, guidance and support
- □ Provide financial assistance for low-cost interventions (physician visits, medications, transportation etc.)

BRIDGE COMMUNITY CARE









Results, Success

- 45% Reduction in visits over 1 Year
- 69% Reduction at 1 year post discharge
- 300 Patients have received service
- Reduced ED bottlenecks-Reduced unnecessary costs



Program Elements

- □ A bio-psychosocial whole person care approach
- Requires collaboration with multiple community wide stakeholders including providers, mental health facilities, managed care, safety net clinics, pain clinics, EMS, and police
- Each individual receives services for one year, however subsequent visits are continually monitored
- Bridge Care provides education on disease management, navigation of the healthcare system, guidance, and support to each individual as needed

Wins/Challenges

- ☐ Strong community presence
- ☐ Initiated an ED policy on the treatment of chronic pain
- ☐ Contributed to the community health benefit
- ☐ Inconsistent treatment of chronic pain in the ED
- □ Access to PCP and specialists
- ☐ Lack of resources for the Severely Persistent Mentally III
